To succeed in this role, you will have a good grasp on delivering data-oriented projects with multiple stakeholders, be a great communicator and team player. You will ideally have at least 5 years of experience in program management.

Your Responsibilities will be:

- Plan the overall program and monitor progress through weekly reports against milestones and escalation of issues to the Program Executive.
- Define the program controls, or the processes, procedures, reporting, etc., to manage the program.
- Daily management through the life cycle of the program, including co-ordination of activities across the AIHW which relate to deliverables of the program.
- Monitor and report on the program budget.
- Monitor and report on the risks and issues that might arise over the course of the program life cycle and help to identify measures to correct them when they occur.
- Coordinate the projects and their interdependencies between the various streams in the program.
- Manage and use resources across the various projects in the program
